The Association of Public Health Laboratories (APHL) and the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) are seeking degreed applicants who are interested in starting or furthering an exciting career in laboratory science while working collaboratively with industry leaders and developing professional networks.

Fellowships support a wide spectrum of public health laboratory program areas. Each fellow will be trained in alignment with established public health laboratory core competencies and will work on unique program-specific projects and other initiatives at host laboratories.

When we say “public health laboratory” we mean local, state and territorial government laboratories focused on protecting the public’s health. **That includes laboratories performing human, environmental, animal and food testing to monitor for and detect health threats.**

Regardless of host laboratory type, fellows will participate in training focused on techniques and competencies transferrable to a career in public health laboratory science.

- US citizen or permanent resident with a bachelor’s, master’s or doctorate degree from an accredited institution
- **Start and End Dates:** Flexible
- **Hours and Program Length:** Approximately 40 hours a week for one year

Application Requirements

- Undergraduate and/or graduate transcripts
- 2-3 letters of recommendation
- Resume/CV
- Completed interest and experience survey
- Written narrative to application screening questions
